

# NEW INCA OPENS ITS DOORS TODAY

## "Bolero," Featuring Raft And Lombard, Leads Bill For First of Week

Built in record time of one month, the Inca theater will be opened to the public at 1 p. m. today, it was announced last night.

Paramount pictures will be shown exclusively at the new theater. The opening program, which will show through Tuesday, is George Raft in "Bolero." Carole Lombard plays the feminine lead and Sally Rand, fan dancer, is in the cast.
