

# TO BEGIN WORK ON NEW THEATER

## L. L. Hancock Will Manage Inca, Being Constructed At 110 West Seventh

Work will be started this morning on a new theater at 110 West Seventh street. It will be completed in about 30 days and will be under the management of L. L. Hancock, who was manager of the Hippodrome, it was announced yesterday.

The new theater will be known as the Inca. It is being established by the Inca Amusement company. Construction and remodeling work is to be done by the Artmor Contracting company of Denver, specialists in theater building.

No definite figure on the cost of the new enterprise was given, but it was understood that several thousand dollars will be spent in remodeling and equipping the building. It will have a seating capacity of approximately 500, Mr. Hancock said.

The new theater will be 25 by 140 feet, inside dimensions. The box office will be located at the inside edge of the sidewalk. Patrons will pass into a lobby and then into a foyer, which will have rest rooms on either side, before entering the theater proper.

A stage sufficiently large for any vaudeville show will be constructed, with dressing rooms below, Mr. Hancock explained.

"All of the finest equipment will be used throughout," the manager asserted.
